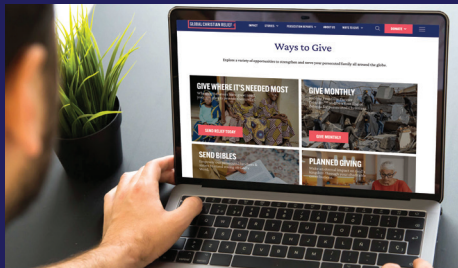

Prayers 1-4: Bonded No More

Raheel and Ruth endured more than two decades of crushing labor in a Pakistani brick kiln—until the day God opened the door to freedom. Their faith fueled resilience, and today, they're rebuilding their lives, lifting others up with the same courage that carried them through.

Prayers 5-8: Freedom's First Prayer

Khalid and Shabana's family endured 15 long years of debt bondage, making endless bricks with little hope for escape. When freedom finally came, Khalid's first prayer wasn't for himself, but for others still trapped—showing the kind of selfless faith that grows even in the hardest places.

Prayers 9-12: The Hustle of Hope

Asid and Rabia's journey shows the extraordinary determination that blooms when freedom is given a chance. After escaping eight years of bondage, they worked tirelessly to build a future for their daughters—proving that with faith and opportunity, new beginnings are possible.

“Please help all those people who are under the slavery of debt so they could also have a better life.”

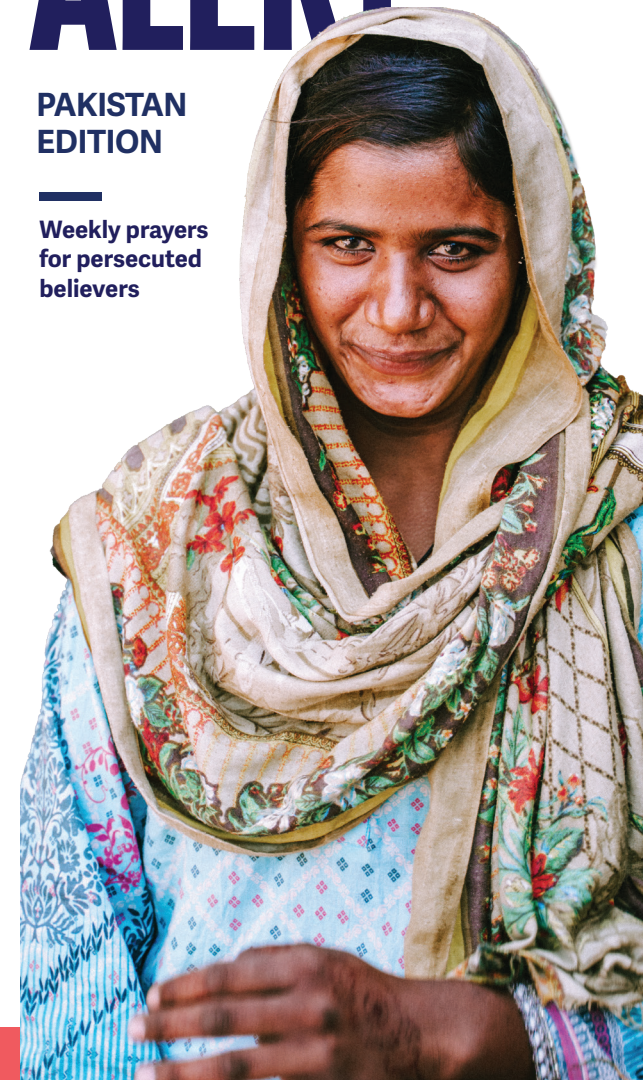

Raheel and Ruth

PRAYER 1: JULY 1-6

Jesus, protect Christians still trapped in bonded labor.

Raheel and Ruth were once among the many trapped in debt slavery, laboring in harsh, unjust conditions. Pray for the safety and strength of those still waiting for release.

“He gives justice to the oppressed and food to the hungry. The LORD frees the prisoners...” – Psalm 146:7

PRAYER 2: JULY 7-13

Lord, bless families rebuilding after slavery.

Freed from the kiln, Raheel and Ruth are now running a small business and reclaiming their dignity. Ask God to provide similar hope and provision for others beginning this same journey.

“The LORD will always lead you, satisfy you in a parched land, and strengthen your bones.” – Isaiah 58:11

PRAYER 3: JULY 14-20

Father, grow the church through kiln-side faith.

Even while enslaved, Raheel and Ruth served as church elders, encouraging others in their faith. Pray that their bold witness will inspire a movement of faith within oppressed communities.

“That light shines in the darkness, and yet the darkness did not overcome it.” – John 1:5

PRAYER 4: JULY 21-27

God, let children dream again.

Now free, Raheel and Ruth’s children dream of becoming a tailor, a barber, a mechanic, and a police officer. Ask the Lord to protect and equip these young dreamers—and all children rising from hardship—to step into a new future.

“For I know the plans I have for you—this is the LORD’s declaration—plans for your well-being, not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope.” – Jeremiah 29:11

PRAYER 5: JULY 28-AUGUST 3

Jesus, multiply freedom for families still waiting.

Like Khalid, thousands remain trapped in debt they cannot escape. Pray that more families will be released—and that those who are freed will boldly intercede for others still in bondage.

“He brought them out of darkness and gloom and broke their chains apart.” – Psalm 107:14

PRAYER 6: AUGUST 4-10

Lord, bless the humble beginnings of a new life.

Khalid now earns a fair wage for the first time. Ask God to bless this new season of freedom and provide lasting stability for his family and others like them.

“Do not despise these small beginnings, for the LORD rejoices to see the work begin...” – Zechariah 4:10

PRAYER 7: AUGUST 11-17

Father, inspire servant-hearted dreams.

Khalid’s children—Adeel, Bilal, and Farhan—are dreaming big, not just for themselves, but for others. Pray that God would raise up a generation of leaders from the kilns who seek justice and mercy for all.

“But among you it will be different. Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant.” – Matthew 20:26

PRAYER 8: AUGUST 18-24

God, ignite contagious hope.

Khalid couldn’t sleep the night before his freedom. Ask the Holy Spirit to awaken hearts with that same expectant hope for the future in the brick kilns throughout Pakistan.

“Let us hold tightly without wavering to the hope we affirm, for God can be trusted to keep his promise.” – Hebrews 10:23

PRAYER 9: AUGUST 25-31

Jesus, bless the work of freed hands.

Asid and Rabia are hustling to build a new life—using a brick loader, working catering jobs, and reclaiming their dignity. Pray that God would prosper their work and multiply their efforts.

“Commit your actions to the LORD, and your plans will succeed.” – Proverbs 16:3

PRAYER 10: SEPTEMBER 1-7

Lord, open doors through education and citizenship.

With official documents secured, Asid and Rabia’s daughters can now access education and new opportunities. Pray for their future to be filled with hope, learning, and growth.

“He lifts the poor from the dust and the needy from the garbage dump.” – Psalm 113:7

PRAYER 11: SEPTEMBER 8-14

Father, establish strong foundations for new homes.

Asid and Rabia are saving to move onto their newly purchased land. Pray that their dream of a safe, stable home becomes reality—and that their house will be a place of blessing.

“Unless the LORD builds a house, the work of the builders is wasted. Unless the LORD protects a city, guarding it with sentries will do no good.” – Psalm 127:1

PRAYER 12: SEPTEMBER 15-30

God, deepen faith through every breakthrough.

Their faith has grown stronger through their freedom journey. Pray that Asid, Rabia, and their daughters will continue to experience God’s miraculous provision and grow in trust each day.
