

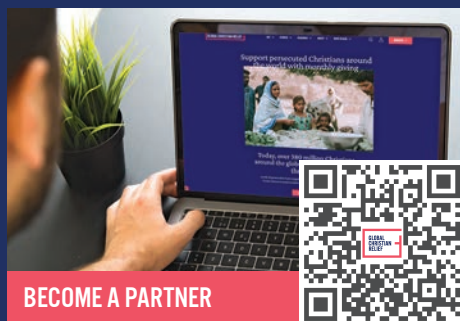

Prayers 1–4: The Debt That Won't Let Go

After an accident and cancer left Hassan disabled, medical debt pushed Hassan and Nasreen Bibi into brick-kiln bondage just to survive. Now they live under a burden they cannot outrun, caring for their young daughter and longing for a chance to begin again beyond the kilns.

Prayers 5–8: Faith That Sustains

Years of brick-kiln labor left Aslam injured and the family worn down, and Alice carried the weight at home while caring for their daughter, Muskan, who has significant health needs. Then, on “Freedom Day,” their debt was paid and a new season began.

Prayers 9–12: The Cycle Breaks

Mumtaz began working the kilns at 10 years old – just like his father before him, and his grandfather before that. When his own 10-year-old son started making bricks beside him, Mumtaz feared the cycle would never end. Then the news came: Their debt had been paid, and they were free. Pray that God would break generational chains, and bring deliverance that opens the door to a new future.

“Our prayer is that it stops with my children, that their children do not get into this work.” – Mumtaz



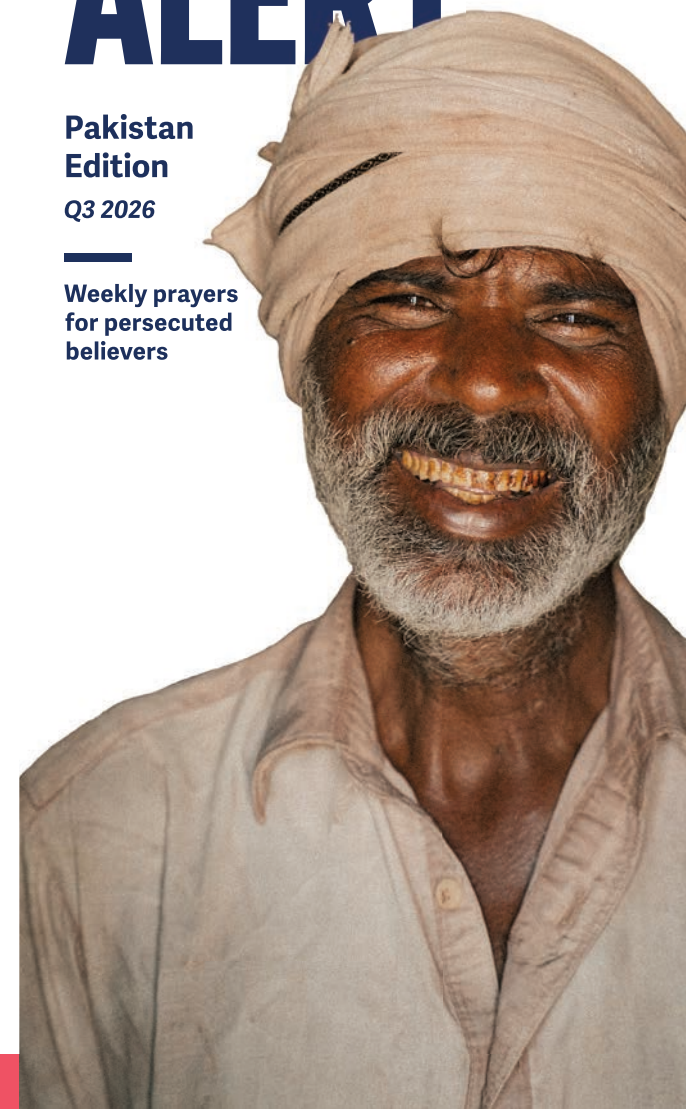

PRAYER 1: JULY 1-8

Pay the debt and set them free!

Father, please make a way for this debt to be paid off, and bring Hassan and Nasreen Bibi out of bondage. Protect their family from harm and exploitation.

“See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.” (Isaiah 43:19)

PRAYER 2: JULY 9-16

Provide a steady livelihood.

Lord, open the right opportunity for income and honest work, especially work Hassan can do with dignity and strength. Establish the work of their hands, and provide what this family needs each day.

“May the favor of the Lord our God rest on us; establish the work of our hands for us – yes, establish the work of our hands.” (Psalm 90:17)

PRAYER 3: JULY 17-24

Make a way for their daughter to learn.

Father, when freedom comes, provide what is needed for Hassan and Nasreen’s daughter to start school. Protect her future, and let education become a path to safety and hope.

“So there is hope for your descendants,’ declares the LORD. ‘Your children will return to their own land.’” (Jeremiah 31:17)

PRAYER 4: JULY 25-AUGUST 1

Strengthen their faith as they wait.

Lord, remind Hassan and Nasreen Bibi that You see them and hear their prayers. Sustain their faith when the days feel long, and let them know Your closeness in suffering.

“The eyes of the LORD are on the righteous, and his ears are attentive to their cry.” (Psalm 34:15)

PRAYER 5: AUGUST 2-9

Bring healing to Muskan.

Lord, bless Muskan and keep her healthy. Bring healing where her body is weak, help her grow even when progress is hard to see, and let her family know she is precious and made in Your image.

“He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.” (Psalm 147:3)

PRAYER 6: AUGUST 10-17

Guide their new season.

Father, as this family starts life free and independent, go before them with Your favor. Give them wisdom for each decision, provide the right relationships and opportunities, and protect them from fear and uncertainty.

“If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you.” (James 1:5)

PRAYER 7: AUGUST 18-25

Make them a light in Pakistan.

Jesus, fill Aslam and Alice with courage and love. Let their home and their story point others to You, and empower them to shine with hope in their community.

“In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.” (Matthew 5:16)

PRAYER 8: AUGUST 26-SEPTEMBER 2

Thank You for answered prayer.

Father, thank You for bringing Aslam and Alice into freedom. Mark this day in their hearts as a reminder that You hear the cries of Your people, and You are faithful to save.

“The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.” (Psalm 34:18)

PRAYER 9: SEPTEMBER 3-9

Break the cycle for the next generation.

Father, protect children who are working in the kilns today. Break the patterns that have held families for generations, and open a real path to safety for every child.

“Defend the weak and the fatherless; uphold the cause of the poor and the oppressed. Rescue the weak and the needy; deliver them from the hand of the wicked.” (Psalm 82:3-4)

PRAYER 10: SEPTEMBER 10-16

Give children a future through education.

Lord, provide the resources, access, and protection these children need to learn. Let schooling become a doorway to a new life, and give parents wisdom and strength to keep their children growing in hope.

“For I know the plans I have for you,” declares the LORD, “plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.” (Jeremiah 29:11)

PRAYER 11: SEPTEMBER 17-23

Deliver families still trapped.

God, remember those who are still oppressed and cannot see a way out. Sustain them, protect them from abuse, and bring rescue in Your timing through just leaders and faithful people who will not look away.

“Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute.” (Proverbs 31:8)

PRAYER 12: SEPTEMBER 24-30

Bless those who help set captives free.

Father, thank You for those who give so families can be freed. Bless them, provide for them, and use their generosity to bring freedom to many more who are still waiting.

“Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.” (Galatians 6:10)
